



### Academic Library in India

### NALANDA LIBRARY (4<sup>TH</sup> CENTURY INDIA)



The library of Nalanda, known as *Dharma Gunj* (Mountain of Truth) or Dharmagañja (Treasury of Truth), was the most renowned repository of Buddhist knowledge in the world at the time. Its collection was said to comprise hundreds of thousands of volumes, so extensive that it burned for months when set aflame by Muslim invaders.

### LIS Education in India: historical movement

Formal library education in India has a history of 100 years behind it. Chronological developments as reported in the literature reveal the following as important milestones in the history of LIS education in India.

- ▶ John Macfarlane, the first Librarian of the Imperial Library (now the National Library) Kolkata started the first in- service training program for the staff in 1901.
- ▶ W.A. Borden initiated training for librarians at the invitation of Maharaja Sayajirao Gaikwad of Baroda in 1911.
- Asa Don Dickinson started a systematic training programme at the Punjab University in Lahore in 1915. This was first university course in the undivided India. He also prepared a manual namely, "The Punjab Library Primer.

### Background



- India is second largest populated country of the world with over 19,500 different languages/Dialects spoken as Mother Tongues.
- It has over 882 universities of different types and thousand of national level labs.
- India ranked 9th in total no. of documents and has 2,044,234 papers as per the Scopus as on June 13, 2019.
- University Grants Commission (UGC) is the authoritative body for implementing the Decisions for the Universities in India.
- It is mandatory to check the Manuscripts with Turnitin/Urkund. The same is accepted for submission once it is cleared with acceptable similarity. As per August 2018 regulation, only upto 10% similarity is allowed.
- It is mandatory for all the universities to upload full text of the Theses in ShodhGanga National Repository with Open Access which currently has over 207,409 Ph.D. Theses (http://shodhganga.inflibnet.ac.in).

# Is there a need of Libraries and Librarians in this age?

- Answer is Big Yes as the Libraries and Librarians are becoming more and more important in the Digital Environment
- Librarians have great opportunities and bright career prospects as long as they improve their professional and technological competencies and grab them
- They need to have enthusiasm for life-long learning and new roles, will-power (because nothing will come easily), assertiveness, creative thinking, self-confidence and innovativeness
- If the Users can not come to the Library, let the Library reach to them as per their convenience and the way they want
- Need the ability to see the library through their patron's eye rather than through a librarian's eye.
